

**Central City Concern
Alcohol and Drug Free Permanent Housing
Resident Data from 2005-2006**

- 252 total units in three downtown buildings:
 - Sally McCracken (93 units) and Mark O. Hatfield (102 units), renovated Single Room Occupancy buildings, opened in 1989 and 1994
 - 57 units in 8 NW 8 building, 180 unit building newly constructed in 2004
- Permanent Section 8 Alcohol and Drug Free Community housing for single adults
- Residents must be income eligible for Section 8 and agree not to use alcohol or drugs while living in this clean and sober community

The following data was summarized from HUD Annual Performance Reports for fiscal year 2005-2006.

356 people lived in the permanent Section 8 units in these three buildings during the year. 117 people moved in and 115 people moved out.

Of the 115 residents who moved out during the year:

37 (32%) entered with zero income
10 (9%) entered with employment income
63 (55%) exited with employment income

4 (4%) entered with benefits/entitlements (social security/veterans benefits)
17 (15%) exited with benefits/entitlements (social security/veterans benefits)

Of the total 356 residents during the year:

31% lived in this housing for more than two years.

At the end of the reporting year, 53 residents had moved into other permanent housing and 230 residents remained in the Sally McCracken, Hatfield and 8 NW 8 permanent housing. **Of the total 356 people served over the course of the year, 79% remained permanently housed during the 2005-2006 fiscal year.**

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
